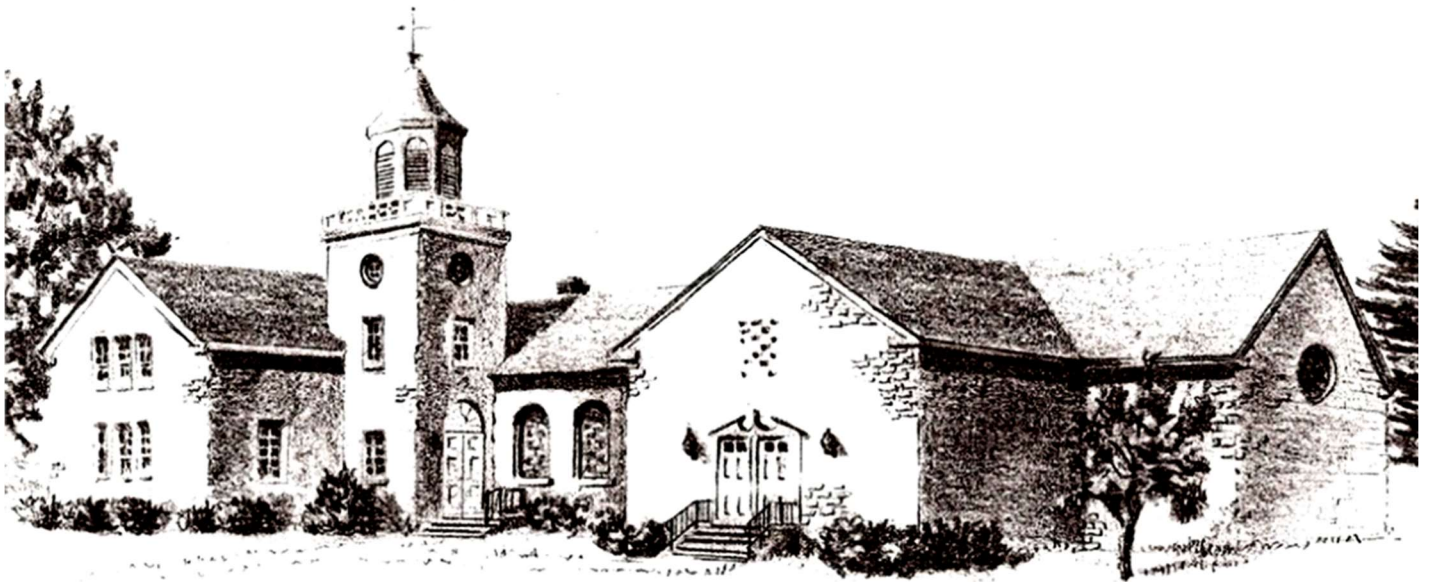

PRAYER OF CONFESSION & PROMISE OF FORGIVENESS

As lovers of God who also love our country, let us repent both the individual and corporate evil that has afflicted our history.

Loving God, we confess the sins which have infested and blighted our culture and alienated us from one other and from you.

We repent the racism, sometimes open, sometimes unintentional, which has increased the loneliness and misery of minority groups.

We confess our reluctance to understand or alleviate the pain of Native Americans; we repent the massacres which took place as well as present-day evasions and injustices.

We repent the slavery that took people from their homes, tore families apart, and turned generations into chattels. We confess the misuse, torture, and rape that was condoned by too many for too long.

We confess our resistance to seeing our history from the perspective of all peoples, including the oppressed and the children of the oppressed.

We repent our ignorant, and at times willful, abuse of the land and its creatures, and our defiling of the soil, air, and water.

We confess the destruction of forests, depletion of the ozone layer, extinction of unique animals, salination of large tracts of lands, and pollution of river systems.

We repent our past arrogance towards the races of the South American, Asian, and African continents.

We confess hiding behind the infamous "White Man's Burden," exploiting our neighbors, resenting refugees, and using aid for political purposes.

We repent our apathy, and sometimes scorn, towards the unemployed and the unemployable.

We confess the sin of condemning youth to frustration and futility, or discarding loyal employees as they grow old.

We repent our slide into opinion-poll morality, the cult of self-indulgence, and taxation by gluttony.

We confess the politics of expediency, the lack of prophetic courage, the use of the media for mass lying.

We confess a legal system that favors the rich and a church culture which favors the respectable.

We repent our neglect of prayer, scripture, social justice, evangelism, and our reluctance to make friends among the least of these for Christ's sake.

Lord have mercy. Christ have mercy. Lord have mercy on us all.

My friends, let this be a true Independence Day as we embrace freedom in Christ for our entire nation. Listen to the Gospel: God did not send his Son to condemn the world but that through Christ this world might be saved. We are a much loved and forgiven people!
