"Is he here yet?" "I'm too excited to sleep." "How many more days?" "How many more minutes?" Familiar words during the holidays whether you are talking Santa Claus or favorite Grandpa Joe. As I was growing up, that was the extent of waiting at Christmas time as I understood it. There was no "Advent" time. I was raised Southern Baptist. The first coming had already happened, and the second coming was a year-round, day-to-day expectation. Hope, peace, joy, and love only related to the Christmas story as told in the carols that I loved to sing. Intellectually, I knew the nativity was rooted in the Old Testament prophecies but I didn't appreciate how they were promises for the Hebrews from their God. Advent gives us Christians an opportunity to appreciate and learn from the faithfulness of the Jews as they waited 700 years from the time of Isaiah to the time of Gabriel appearing to a young maiden in Nazareth.

Going back to the year 1322 (700 years ago), most of us don't know who our ancestors were although a few of us may know the general neighborhood where they lived. Way back then, during what we call the High Middle Ages, there was no concept of a reformed church in a free country. But they knew what it was to serve Jesus Christ as their Savior. They knew the meaning of hope, peace, joy, and love as revealed in the promises of God to all people of every age. They even sang some of the same carols.

With such a great cloud of witnesses, are we willing to wait on the scale of 700 years? Are we willing to be content with just the hope, peace, joy, and love of the promises of God? We have already been blessed with abundant life through the first coming. But we look around and see what we don't have as a church. We're like children searching for the coveted gifts under the tree. More youth. More people. More resources. More... more. Advent asks us: is it enough to wait when we have Hope, Peace, Joy, Love, and, most of all, Christ?



Operating Results...

Year-to-date contributions toward pledges are 5% below last year and 13%, below the budget. Non-Pledge contributions are +16% and -7%, respectively and Plate is +174% and +121%, respectively. Overall, contributions are basically the same as last year and 10% below the budget. Expenses are well within the budget which has been updated for the added costs of our new full-time pastor. The primary reasons that they are higher than last year are the payment to Pastor Hicks for unused vacation and the increased costs of salary & payroll overheads for Pastor Nancy. No administrative aid payroll for 2 1/2 months more than offset the small increases in other budget categories.

Stewardship...

As of November 14th, 21 pledges totaling \$60,820 have been received for 2023. 20 are repeat pledgers and one is new. Of the 20 who also pledged last year, 10 increased their pledge by an average of 17%, 1 decreased (looks like the difference is the amount of the per-capita assessment) and 9 stayed the same. Hopefully the 16 outstanding pledges will come in soon so that the 2023 budget can be finalized. If you need a pledge card or would like it picked up, please call the church office at (607) 844-8321. 
