


Keeping Our Church Family Cozy

Considering that \$20 gifts a flock of chicks, \$120 gifts a goat, sheep or pig, \$500 gifts a heifer, and \$250 gifts a water buffalo to recipients, along with appropriate training in animal care, this is a good witness of this church responding to the ministry of Jesus Christ. What is Per Capita?

Per capita is a set amount of money (apportionment) per member that congregations pay to the larger denomination to cover the expenses associated with regional and national efforts to enable, encourage, and enhance the ministry of the local church.

How Can You Help? Session requests that members contribute \$43.95 above their normal giving to cover their per capita portion. Thank you.

Paying per capita is similar to:

- contributing to a dish-to-share meal
- paying to be connected to the internet
- paying for the benefit of utilities
- pitching in with other passengers to pay for gasoline for a road trip

Finance and Facilities Report

Contributions on December 4th were up significantly which should improve the percentages. Expenses continue to be well within the budget. They are ahead of last year for the same two reasons stated last month the payment to Pastor Hicks for unused vacation and the increased costs of salary & payroll overheads for our new full-time pastor. Based on the budget, net income at the end of the year was expected to be negative \$30,037. However, based on the actual results to date, we expect net income at the end of the year to be about negative \$27,000. The shortfall will be offset with part of the Session Discretionary Reserve.

<u>Stewardship...</u>

We are coming close to the end of the 2023 stewardship campaign with 4 pledges still outstanding. As of December 20th, 34 pledges totaling 94,610 have been received. 1 is a new pledge, 2 converted from nonpledge to pledge and 31 pledged last year as well. Of the 31 repeat pledgers, 16 increased on average 14%, 1 decreased and 13 remained the same. 36 pledges totaling \$101,050 were received last year. *Thanks everyone for your continued support.*

Budget...

Hopefully by the time you read this, all four of the outstanding pledges will be received so that the 2023 budget can be finalized. In addition to pledges, the preliminary budget that was sent out with the steward-ship letter will be adjusted to avoid a double count for those who converted from non-pledge to pledge. The budget will also be adjusted for a small change in the Per-Capita-Assessment rate that became known after the preliminary budget was prepared. If any other adjustments are needed, Session will be asked for approval.

Facilities...

At long last, the large crack in the library wall has been repaired. Work was delayed for over a year due to water infiltration from ice dams on the roof through cracks above the window lintels in the library. Thanks goes to Brad Perkins who had a contractor fill huge voids in the wall between the library and the older part of the church with insulation to reduce heat loss and to Dave Parsons who caulked the cracks above the windows. These steps appear to have stopped the water infiltration.

DUTIES OF USHERS

(Revised November 2022)

BEFORE THE SERVICE:

Familiarize yourself with this instruction sheet.

- Unlock the front and main doors. Turn on all lights in sanctuary and fellowship hall. Sanctuary ceiling lights are on a 6-switch panel on the side wall next to sound system. Ceiling light for the back of the sanctuary is outside sanctuary on wall in bell tower vestibule. Fellowship hall lights are near the coat closet.
- Turn on sanctuary fans (only in hot weather): Dial is on sanctuary wall left of west double entry doors. Turn fans on all the way to right (full power), wait a couple seconds, turn back to desired speed.

Bulletins and Hearing Assist Receivers are on back railing.

- Candles: About 15 minutes before start of service, light candles on communion table. Matches and butane lighter on ledge with wicker basket.
- About 15 minutes before service, ring bell (12 slow short peals). Key on column by sound cabinet. Entry to the bell tower is through the door next to balcony.
- Ushering: It is not necessary to usher most people to seats, but if someone needs assistance in finding a seat, please help them. Do not seat people during prayer. Best time is during hymns or announcements. Offer pillows to people who might need them. If someone comes in with a walker, escort them to their seat and then take walker to fellowship hall. Return walker to them at end of service.
- If newcomers arrive with small children, offer the crayons and coloring books kept at the back of the sanctuary.
- If there is a Prayer of Confession or Assurance of Pardon in the bulletin, fill the pitcher on the sanctuary table half full of water.

DURING SERVICE:

Close sanctuary doors. Lock the front door entrance to the church.

- Investigate any not recognized person or disruptive noise in fellowship hall or classrooms. Ushers are responsible for what goes on in the rest of the church during the service. Alert others if you have a concern.
- It is up to parents to decide whether crying babies or disruptive children should be taken out.
- Take attendance on blue colored form in wicker basket. It is important that the count be accurate. Leave completed form in the wicker basket. Ask the sound/AV tech for the number of people attending on Zoom.
- Go forward with collection plates after pastor announces collection & the organ starts playing. Collect from front to back.

Extinguish candles during the last hymn by bringing the taper to the communion table and lighting that wick, then extinguish the two candles and process with taper lit to the back of the sanctuary.

AFTER SERVICE:

- Put wicker basket on chair next to sound system for people to recycle bulletins. Be cordial and friendly, invite newcomers to "come again; have a good week."
- Make pew racks neat in sanctuary, pick up any debris. Turn off sanctuary lights and fan. Ensure the candles are extinguished. <u>Ensure that all 7 doors in church are locked. If you aren't the last leaving</u>, <u>make sure someone else will lock doors</u>.

Return the basket with the used bulletins and attendance sheet on Administrative Assistant's desk. Empty and dry the baptismal font if water was used.

ANY QUESTIONS? Ask the person running the sound system.
