#### Just a Note, by Scott Miller

Messiah, Part III

A couple of months ago, I called part I "the happy part." God loves us, He sent Jesus, and life looks good; part I is very cozy. It's the part we understand best and requires nothing from us but to open the gift and say thank you.

Part II shows us just how cruel we are and that this was part of the plan all along. Just look at the texts used, we don't see the New Testament until after "Christ's Ascension." God knew who he was trying to save and sent His Son anyway. Speaking for myself that's a bit of a "guilt trip." [Time out to say, "Thank You."] This is not to say that part II is a complete "downer." Christ wins, conquers death, ascends and the Gospel Word is spread to anyone who can hear. We end with the "Hallelujah Chorus" and if that doesn't make you feel uplifted, nothing will.

Part III is quite short, about 1/6 of the entire work. For scripture references see https:// haventoday.org/blog/handels-messiah-lyrics-verse-references/ and scroll down about ½ way. We're promised eternal life, warned of the judgement, sin is conquered, and the Messiah is acclaimed. The mood is happy, scary, promising, and challenging but in the end "Worthy is the Lamb."

Just in case you're not sure, I'll come right out and say it, "I like the Messiah, a lot!" It's a complete "Intro to the New Covenant" course. I have many favorites in this work but if I had to pick one – I'd be hard put to do it. I get down to two, the "Hallelujah Chorus" and "Worthy Is the Lamb."

A common legend is that Messiah was completed in 2 weeks, but that isn't quite true; 24 days is the actual length of time. At the end of the manuscript Handel wrote "SDG" - "Soli Deo Gloria" or "To God alone be the glory."

Handel made several revisions during his lifetime to fit the resources of the performers. This includes the 1742 Dublin Premier. It is thought that Messiah, as originally written, was not performed during Handel's lifetime.

Handel's plan for the premier was for a charity concert to benefit the "prisoners' debt relief," "Mercer's Hospital" and the "Charitable Infirmary." The concert raised £400, today's value converted to dollars would be \$101,597.71. Very generous.

In order to accommodate the largest possible audience, gentlemen were asked to remove their swords and ladies were asked not to wear hoops in their dresses.
