
Several members joined in a prayer meeting while at Treleaven Winery listening to Alan MaComber's band., The Mike Shaw Band.







## Finance and Facilities Report

#### **Operating Results...**

Due to the crash of the treasurer's hard drive, data for August & September is still unavailable. She is in the process of reloading the new drive.

#### 2023 Preliminary Budget...

A copy of the 2023 preliminary budget is included with this year's stewardship letter which you have either received or will soon. Following is a brief comparison of the major line items with 2021 actual and the 2022 budget.

Pledges shown in the 2023 budget column is the total of the amounts actually pledged for 2022. It will be updated after the stewardship campaign is completed. 2023 Non-Pledge and Plate contributions have been set close to the amount actually received for 12 months ended July, 2022. The increase in the Interest, Dividends & Misc. Income line for 2023 reflects planned investments of part of our cash accounts in CDs. The major change in 2022 & 2023 expenses is the arrival of our new full-time pastor in June of this year. Other significant changes as compared to 2021 are the increased costs of insurance and utilities. These were reflected in the 2022 budget however further increases are anticipated in 2023. The 2023 budget also includes small increases in our staff's payroll and changes (up & down) in several other expense line items. Any shortfall in Net Income in 2022 or 2023 will result in a draw from the Session Discretionary Reserve or other savings.
