2023 Christmas Joy

PC(USA) has since the 1930's celebrated the birth of Jesus Christ with a Special Offering, the Christmas Joy Offering, in which this church has long participated, to support our past, present, and future leaders. This offering is divided equally to Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions and to Presbyterian-related schools and colleges particularly equipping communities of color. For 2022, \$1.1 million provided critical support and grants for current and retired Presbyterian church workers in need; thus 272 income supplements for individuals, 223 housing supplements, and 621 emergency assistance grants were possible. The other \$1.1 million aided future church leaders at Menaul School in Albuquerque, NM, Presbyterian Pan American School in Kingsville, TX, and Stillman College in Tuscaloosa, AL. Bulletin inserts for 2 weeks provide examples of how lives are touched. We are soliciting contributions as you are able for the next 2 weeks.
